SENATE BILL No. 513

May 21, 2003, Introduced by Senator TOY and referred to the Committee on Local, Urban and State Affairs.

A bill to amend 1968 PA 251, entitled

"Cemetery regulation act,"

by amending the title and sections 2, 8, 9, 10, 12, 12a, 13, 15, 18, 19, and 21 (MCL 456.522, 456.528, 456.529, 456.530, 456.532, 456.532a, 456.533, 456.535, 456.538, 456.539, and 456.541), the title and sections 2, 8, 12, 12a, 13, 15, 18, 19, and 21 as amended by 1982 PA 132, section 9 as amended by 2002 PA 550, and section 10 as amended by 1982 PA 289; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to regulate the creation and management of
cemeteries; to regulate the sale of cemetery services and
merchandise; to provide for a cemetery commissioner, and to
prescribe the powers and duties of the commissioner; to require

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1 the registration and audit of cemeteries; to regulate persons 2 selling burial, entombment, or columbarium rights; -, cemetery 3 services, or cemetery merchandise; and to prescribe remedies and 4 penalties.

5 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

6 (a) "Cemetery" means 1 or a combination of more than 1 of the7 following:

8 (i) A burial ground for earth interments.

9 (*ii*) A mausoleum for crypt entombments.

10 (*iii*) A crematory for the cremation for human remains.

11 (*iv*) A columbarium for the <u>deposit</u> inurnment of cremated
12 remains.

13 (b) "Interment" means the disposition of human remains by14 earth interment, entombment, or inurnment.

15 (c) "Burial right" means a right of earth interment.

16 (d) "Entombment right" means the right of crypt entombment in17 a mausoleum or in an aboveground vault.

18 (e) "Columbarium right" means the right of inurnment in a19 columbarium for cremated remains.

20 (f) "Mausoleum" means a <u>structure used</u>, or intended to be
21 used, for the entombment in a crypt or crypts in the structure of
22 the remains of deceased persons building or other aboveground
23 structure that is affixed to land and is a permanent repository
24 for human remains.

25 (g) "Crypt" means a chamber in a mausoleum of sufficient size26 to entomb the uncremated remains of a deceased person.

27 (h) "Columbarium" means a <u>structure or room or other space</u>

in a building or other aboveground structure used or intended
 to be used for the inurnment or deposit of that is affixed to

4 (i) "Crematory" means a building or structure, within which
5 the remains of deceased persons are or are intended to be
6 cremated.

land and is a permanent repository for cremated human remains.

7 (j) "Cremation" means the incineration of the body of the8 deceased person.

9 (k) "Cemetery services" means all services offered to the
10 public, including grave opening, closings, and foundation

11 installation.

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12 (1) "Cemetery merchandise" means all merchandise sold to the

13 public by a cemetery, including vaults, concrete boxes,

14 monuments, memorials, and foundations.

15 (k) (m) "Cemetery commissioner" or "commissioner" means the 16 director of <u>licensing and regulation</u> the department of consumer 17 and industry services or a designee of the director.

18 (l) "Municipal corporation" means that term as defined in19 section 1 of 1927 PA 10, MCL 456.181.

(m) "Person" means an individual, group of individuals, sole
proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company,
association, corporation, government agency, cemetery, or a

23 combination of these legal entities.

Sec. 8. The commissioner may promulgate rules in accordance with and subject to <u>Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, as</u> amended, being sections 24.201 to 24.315 of the Michigan Compiled <u>Laws</u> the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL

24.201 to 24.328, to implement and administer this act, including
 rules regarding all of the following:

3 (a) The <u>maintaining</u> maintenance of records relative to the
4 financial aspects of cemeteries.

5 (b) Requirements for applications for the granting of permits6 and registrations required under this act.

7 (c) The formal and informal procedures governing the conduct
8 of contested cases under this act before the commissioner or an
9 authorized hearing officer.

10 (d) Requirements for the establishment and maintenance of 11 special trust funds to provide for the future performance 12 obligations and special care or decoration obligations of 13 cemeteries.

14 Sec. 9. (1) The commissioner may hold **administrative** hearings, administer oaths, take testimony under oath, and 15 request in writing the appearance and testimony of witnesses, 16 including the production of books and records pursuant to the 17 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 18 24.328. Upon the refusal of a witness to appear, testify, or 19 submit books and records after a written request, the 20 21 commissioner or a party to a contested case may apply to the 22 circuit court for Ingham county for a subpoena or a subpoena 23 duces tecum. The court shall issue a subpoena when reasonable 24 grounds are shown.

(2) When If it appears to the commissioner that a person or
registrant has violated this act or a rule promulgated or order
issued under this act, the commissioner may do 1 or more of the

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1 following:

2 (a) Issue a cease and desist order.

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(b) Accept an assurance of discontinuance.

4 (c) Bring an action in the circuit court for the county in
5 which the person resides or in the circuit court for the county
6 of Ingham, to enforce compliance with this act or a rule
7 promulgated or order issued under this act.

(3) Upon a proper showing regarding an action brought under 8 subsection (2)(c), a permanent or temporary injunction or a 9 restraining order may be granted and a receiver or conservator 10 may be appointed by the court. A receiver or conservator 11 12 appointed by the court may take possession of the assets and may 13 sell, assign, transfer, or convey the cemetery to a municipal corporation or other person other than the holder of a license 14 for the practice of mortuary science or a person who owns, 15 manages, supervises, operates, or maintains, either directly or 16 indirectly, a funeral establishment, under conditions prescribed 17 18 by the court -, in order to discharge outstanding contractual obligations. A receiver appointed under this section has all the 19 powers, authority, and remedies of an assignee for the benefit of 20 21 creditors under chapter 52 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.5201 to 600.5265. The court may allow the 22 receiver or conservator to file for protection under the 23 24 bankruptcy code.

(4) In the order of sale of the cemetery, the court shall
make provision for notice to creditors and the filing of claims
against the receivership or conservatorship. Any remaining funds

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1 held by the cemetery in escrow under this act belong to the 2 contract buyers or beneficiaries of the contract buyers and shall 3 not be distributed to the general creditors of the cemetery. 4 This section does not prohibit the court from allowing the sale 5 of the cemetery to a person other than the holder of a license 6 for the practice of mortuary science or a person who owns, 7 manages, supervises, operates, or maintains, either directly or 8 indirectly, a funeral establishment, or to a municipal

9 corporation.

(5) In addition to an action taken under this section, the 10 11 commissioner may deny an application or may suspend or revoke a 12 permit or registration after a hearing as set forth in this act. 13 (6) As used in this section, "municipal corporation" means that term as defined in section 1 of 1927 PA 10, MCL 456.181. 14 Sec. 10. (1) The commissioner shall institute and maintain 15 a system of auditing trust funds required by this act and of 16 17 registering each cemetery authorized to be created, maintained, and operated under Act No. 12 of the Public Acts of 1869, as 18 amended, being sections 456.101 to 456.119 of the Michigan 19 20 Compiled Laws- 1869 PA 12, MCL 456.101 to 456.119, and -Act 21 No. 87 of the Public Acts of 1855, as amended, being sections 456.1 to 456.36 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1855 PA 87, MCL 22 456.1 to 456.36, and conducting sales under the prepaid funeral 23 and cemetery sales act, 1986 PA 255, MCL 328.211 to 328.235, as 24 well as any other cemetery operating under state law or local 25 26 27 municipal corporation, church, or religious institution - shall

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be- is exempt from this act. However, a <u>municipality</u> municipal
 corporation may pass ordinances necessary for regulating that
 <u>municipality's</u> municipal corporation's cemeteries.

4 (2) A cemetery for earth interment of 10 acres or less in size, which is owned and operated entirely and exclusively by an 5 existing nonprofit entity and in which a burial has taken place 6 before September 15, 1968, -shall be is exempt from the fee 7 provisions of this act, ... That cemetery shall have -its the 8 trust fund required by this act audited at the discretion of the 9 commissioner, ... It shall also be and is exempt from the 10 endowment care trust fund requirements of section -16- 12a of the 11 12 prepaid funeral and cemetery sales act, 1986 PA 255, MCL 13 328.222a, except as to the care fund for the report requirements if the cemetery maintains - care or memorial funds. 14

(3) On a periodic basis determined appropriate by the commissioner but not less than once every 3 years, the commission shall inspect the facilities and grounds of a cemetery. The commission may charge the cemetery for the actual expenses for the inspection but not more than \$1,000.00.

20 Sec. 12. (1) A person or business entity shall not 21 establish a cemetery without a valid permit or operate an 22 existing cemetery except under a valid registration **issued** under 23 this act.

(2) If a person <u>or business entity</u> proposes to purchase or
otherwise acquire a controlling interest in an existing cemetery
company, that person <u>or business entity</u> shall first <u>make</u>
application apply to the commissioner for a certificate of

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1 approval of a proposed change of control of a cemetery company. The application shall contain the name and address of the 2 proposed new owner or operator and other information as the 3 commissioner requires. The commissioner shall issue a 4 5 certificate of approval only after he or she is satisfied that 6 the proposed new owner is qualified by character, experience, and financial responsibility to control and operate the cemetery in a 7 legal and proper manner, and that the interest of the public 8 generally will not be jeopardized by the proposed change in 9 ownership and management. The application for a purchase or 10 change of control must be accompanied by an initial filing or 11 12 investigation fee of \$500.00. As used in this section, 13 "controlling interest" means the capability to decide the 14 operating and financial policies of the cemetery company or to 15 select a majority of the officers or directors of the cemetery 16 company. In deciding whether a person or business entity has or proposes to acquire a controlling interest, the percentage of the 17 18 stock, assets, or other indicia of ownership which a person or business entity acquires or proposes to acquire need not be the 19 20 only factor considered by the commissioner. If a person -or 21 business entity fails to comply with this section, the commissioner shall order that <u>a</u> an administrative hearing be 22 held. If a transfer of controlling interest is found to have 23 24 taken place without prior commissioner approval, the commissioner 25 - in his or her discretion may shall suspend or revoke the registration of the cemetery or take other appropriate action -to 26 27 insure until it demonstrates compliance with this section.

1 (3) A cemetery that operates under a name other than the name under which it is registered pursuant to this act shall include 2 the name under which it is registered in all printed matter or 3 marketing material created by, at the direction of, or on behalf 4 5 of the cemetery. In addition, the name of the person having a controlling interest in the cemetery shall appear as the owner in 6 all printed matter or marketing material created by, at the 7 direction of, or on behalf of the cemetery. If the cemetery has 8 a sales office, the name of the person having a controlling 9 interest in the cemetery shall be conspicuously displayed in the 10 11 lobby of that office.

12 (4) As used in this section, "controlling interest" means the 13 capability to decide the operating and financial policies of the 14 cemetery company or to select the officers or directors with 15 majority control of the cemetery company or the right to receive 16 more than 50% of the dividends or profits.

Sec. 12a. (1) The commissioner or an examiner,
investigator, or other person the commissioner may appoint, may
visit and examine the affairs of any cemetery or <u>business</u>
entity person required to register under this act and shall have
free access to the books, papers, records, and documents that
relate to the business of the cemetery corporation, <u>business</u>
entity person, or agent acting on its behalf.

(2) The books, papers, records, and documents shall be
available for inspection or audit at any time during regular
business hours with reasonable notice. One or more qualified
person persons shall conduct the audit whose services shall be

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charged to and paid by the cemetery at the rate of \$10.00 per
 hour, but not more than <u>\$100.00</u> \$1,000.00 total.

3 Sec. 13. (1) Any person or business entity desiring to
4 establish a cemetery shall file with the commissioner, on forms
5 furnished by the commissioner, an application for a permit to
6 establish a cemetery. The application shall be accompanied by an
7 investigation fee of \$500.00.

8 (2) After a receipt of an application, the commissioner shall
9 make conduct an investigation pertaining to the physical plans,
10 the community need for the planned cemetery, and pertinent
11 information pertaining to the applicant's experience, financial
12 stability, ability, and integrity. If the applicant is -other
13 than not a natural person, the same investigation shall be made
14 of the general manager and principal owners.

15 Sec. 15. (1) Each <u>individual or business entity</u> person 16 operating a cemetery shall register the cemetery by filing with 17 the commissioner a registration application before June 2 of each 18 year, on a form furnished by the commissioner, and accompanied by 19 the registration fee. <u>Registrations shall expire</u> A

20 registration expires on July 1 of each year.

(2) If the commissioner intends to deny registration, the procedure set forth in section 19 shall be followed. The commissioner may impose a late penalty filing fee of \$10.00 per day on <u>an individual or business entity</u> **a person** which filed a registration application after June 1. <u>or on an individual or</u> business entity which files a trust fund report after the due date set forth in this act.

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1 Sec. 18. (1) The commissioner may deny an application filed under this act and refuse to issue a permit or registration, or 2 may suspend or revoke a permit or registration, or may reprimand, 3 place on probation, or take other disciplinary action against the 4 5 applicant if the commissioner's investigation reveals facts 6 which, with reference to the establishment of a cemetery, show inappropriate physical plans; lack of community need; inadequate 7 experience, financial stability, or integrity to protect the 8 public welfare; or when the commissioner finds that the applicant 9 10 or its officers or general manager has done 1 or more of the 11 following:

12 (a) Made a false statement of a material fact in the13 application.

14 (b) Not complied with this act.

(c) Been guilty of <u>a</u> an unlawful or fraudulent act in
connection with selling or otherwise dealing in <u>cemetery lots</u>,
burial rights, funeral or cemetery merchandise or services <u>of a</u>
type required to be registered under this regulated by the
prepaid funeral and cemetery sales act, 1986 PA 255, MCL 328.211
to 328.235.

(d) Been guilty in the judgment of the commissioner of other
conduct whether of the same or different character than specified
in this act which constitutes dishonest and unfair dealing.

24 (e) Violated article 18 of the occupational code, 1980 PA
25 299, MCL 339.1801 to 339.1812.

26 (f) (e) Violated the terms of an assurance of
27 discontinuance entered into with the commissioner pursuant to

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1 section 9(2).

2 (g) Violated the prepaid funeral and cemetery sales act, 1986
3 PA 255, MCL 328.211 to 328.235.

4 (h) Failed to comply with section 2080 of the insurance code 5 of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.2080.

6 (i) (f) Adopted, enforced, or attempted to enforce a regulation of the cemetery -which- that prohibits the 7 installation of a grave memorial or burial vault unless the grave 8 memorial or burial vault was purchased from the cemetery. 9 -However, this This subdivision -shall does not prohibit a 10 cemetery from adopting and enforcing consistent rules and 11 12 regulations to be followed by both the cemetery and outside 13 vendors as to the quality, size, shape, type, installation, and maintenance of the grave memorial or burial vault. 14

15 (2) If the commissioner denies an application for a permit or registration, or suspends or revokes an existing permit or 16 17 registration required by this act, the denial, revocation, or 18 suspension shall revoke the cemetery operation as to the sale or assignment of burial rights, entombment rights, or columbarium 19 20 rights, cemetery merchandise, or cemetery services after the date of the suspension, revocation, or denial. The corporation shall 21 22 fulfill all contractual obligations and agreements entered into before the date of the suspension, revocation, or denial, and 23 shall make required interments for the owners of burial rights, 24 entombment rights, or columbarium rights purchased before the 25 date of suspension, revocation, or denial. 26

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(3) The commissioner may impose an administrative fine of not

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1 more than \$5,000.00 for each separate violation of this act. 2 Sec. 19. If the commissioner intends to deny an application for a permit to establish a cemetery, to refuse registration of 3 an existing cemetery, or to suspend or revoke a registration, the 4 5 commissioner shall give written notice to the person -or business involved of that intent. The notice shall state a time 6 and a place for hearing before the commissioner or a designated 7 8 hearing officer, and a summary statement of the reasons for the proposed action. The notice of intent shall be mailed by 9 certified mail to the applicant at least 15 days before the 10 scheduled hearing date. The commissioner shall hold a hearing 11 12 pursuant to the notice in the manner required by Act No. 306 of 13 the Public Acts of 1969, as amended, being sections 24.201 to 14 24.315 of the Michigan Compiled Laws administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, and the rules of 15 procedure adopted by the commissioner. -, and The commissioner 16 shall <u>make</u> issue a written decision. 17

18 Sec. 21. (1) A person , firm, partnership, association, or 19 corporation who violates this act is guilty of a misdemeanor, 20 and, if a natural person, the first offense shall be punishable 21 by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment for not more 22 than 90 days, and a second offense shall be punishable by a fine 23 of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment for not more than 1 24 year, or both.

(2) If the violator is other than a natural person, the first
offense shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00
and the second offense shall be punishable by a fine of not more

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1 than \$1,000.00.

Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take 2 3 effect unless Senate Bill No. 512

of the 92nd Legislature is enacted into 4 5 law.

6 Enacting section 2. Section 16 of the cemetery regulation 7 act, 1968 PA 251, MCL 456.536, is repealed.
