HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 172

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 73109 and 73110 (MCL 324.73109 and 324.73110), as amended by 1998 PA 546.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 73109. The owner of property on which a violation of this
- 2 part is committed, or his or her lessee, may bring a cause of
- 3 action against a person AN INDIVIDUAL who violates this part for
- 4 \$250.00 \$750.00 or actual property damages, whichever is greater,
- 5 and actual and reasonable attorney fees.
- 6 Sec. 73110. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) OR (3), a
- 7 person AN INDIVIDUAL who violates this part is guilty of a
- 8 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or
- 9 a fine of not less than \$100.00 or more than \$500.00, or both.

- 1 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO KILLS ANY PROTECTED ANIMAL, GAME, OR
- 2 FISH WHILE VIOLATING THIS PART IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 3 PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS OR A FINE OF
- 4 NOT LESS THAN \$250.00 OR MORE THAN \$750.00, OR BOTH.
- 5 (3) (2) A person AN INDIVIDUAL convicted of a second or
- 6 subsequent violation of this part occurring within 3 years of a
- 7 previous violation of this part shall be punished by imprisonment
- 8 for not more than 90 days or a fine of not less than \$250.00 or
- 9 more than \$1,000.00, or both. In addition, the court shall order
- 10 the person's INDIVIDUAL'S license revoked if the person INDIVIDUAL
- 11 is licensed to hunt, fish, or trap in this state, and shall order
- 12 the person INDIVIDUAL not to seek or possess a license for the
- 13 remainder of the calendar year in which the person INDIVIDUAL is
- 14 convicted and during at least 1 succeeding calendar year. This
- 15 subsection does not apply after September 30, 2001.
- 16 (4) (3)—This subsection applies beginning October 1, 2001. A
- 17 person AN INDIVIDUAL convicted of a second or subsequent violation
- 18 of this part occurring within 3 years of a previous violation of
- 19 this part shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than 90
- 20 days or a fine of not less than \$100.00 \$500.00 or more than
- 21 \$1,000.00, \$1,500.00, or both. In addition, the court may order the
- 22 person's INDIVIDUAL'S license revoked if the person INDIVIDUAL is
- 23 licensed to hunt, fish, or trap in this state, and may order the
- 24 person-INDIVIDUAL not to seek or possess a license for not more
- 25 than 3 succeeding calendar years.
- 26 (5) (4)—The court may order a person—AN INDIVIDUAL convicted
- 27 of violating this part to pay the costs of prosecution.

- 1 (6) (5) The following may be seized and forfeited in the same
- 2 manner as provided in chapter 47 of the revised judicature act of
- 3 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.4701 to 600.4709:
- 4 (a) A protected animal, a fur-bearing animal, game, or fish
- 5 taken while committing any violation of this part.
- 6 (b) Property in the possession of the defendant while
- 7 committing a second or subsequent violation of this part occurring
- 8 within 3 years of a previous violation of this part. This
- 9 subdivision does not apply to either of the following:
- 10 (i) Electronic hunting-dog-retrieval equipment.
- 11 (ii) A living or dead animal of any kind not described in
- 12 subdivision (a).
- 13 (7) (6) The court shall order a person AN INDIVIDUAL convicted
- 14 of violating this part to make restitution for any damage arising
- 15 out of the violation, including, but not limited to, reimbursing
- 16 this state for the value of any protected animal, fur-bearing
- 17 animal, game, or fish taken while violating this part as provided
- 18 in section 40119. However, the value of fish shall be determined as
- 19 provided in section 48740.
- 20 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect upon the
- 21 expiration of 90 days after the date it is enacted into law.
- Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 23 unless Senate Bill No. 171 of the 97th Legislature is enacted into
- 24 law.
