# HOUSE BILL NO. 4038

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled

"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"

by amending section 41301 (MCL 324.41301), as amended by 2009 PA 51.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 41301. (1) As used in this part:

2 (a) "Genetically engineered" refers to an organism whose
3 genome, chromosomal or extrachromosomal, is modified permanently
4 and heritably, using recombinant nucleic acid techniques, or the
5 progeny of such an organism.

6 (b) "Introduce", with reference to an organism, means to
7 knowingly and willfully stock, place, plant, release, or allow the
8 release of the organism in this state at any specific location
9 where the organism is not already naturalized.

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(c) "Prohibited species", subject to section 41302, means any

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1 of the following:

2	(i) Any of the following prohibited aquatic plant species,
3	including a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species
4	or a fragment, including a seed or other propagule, of the species
5	or of a hybrid or genetically engineered variant:
6	(A) African oxygen weed (Lagarosiphon major).
7	(B) Brazilian elodea (Egeria densa).
8	(C) Cylindro (Cylindrospermopsis raciborskii).
9	(D) European frogbit (Hydrocharis morsus-ranae).
10	(E) Fanwort (Cabomba caroliniana).
11	(F) Giant hogweed (Heracleum mantegazzianum).
12	<b>(F)</b> <del>(C) </del> Giant salvinia (Salvinia molesta, auriculata, biloba,
13	or herzogii).
14	(G) <del>(H) </del> Hydrilla (Hydrilla verticillata).
15	(I) Japanese knotweed (Fallopia japonica).
16	(H) <del>(J)</del> Parrot's feather (Myriophyllum aquaticum).
17	(I) <del>(K)</del> Starry stonewort (Nitellopsis obtusa).
18	(J) <del>(L) Water chestnut</del> (Trapa natans).
19	(K) <del>(M) Yellow</del> floating heart (Nymphoides peltata).
20	(ii) any of the following prohibited terrestrial plant species,
21	INCLUDING A HYBRID OR GENETICALLY ENGINEERED VARIANT OF THE SPECIES
22	OR A FRAGMENT, INCLUDING A SEED OR OTHER PROPAGULE, OF THE SPECIES
23	OR OF A HYBRID OR GENETICALLY ENGINEERED VARIANT:
24	(A) GIANT HOGWEED (HERACLEUM MANTEGAZZIANUM).
25	(B) JAPANESE KNOTWEED (FALLOPIA JAPONICA).
26	(iii) $(ii)$ —The following prohibited bird species, including a

27 hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species or an egg

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of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered variant:
 Eurasian collared dove (Streptopelia decaocto).

3 (*iv*) (*iii*) The following prohibited crustacean species, including
4 a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species or an egg
5 of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered variant:
6 rusty crayfish (Orconectes rusticus).

7 (v) (iv) Any of the following prohibited fish species,
8 including a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species
9 or an egg of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered
10 variant:

11 (A) Bighead carp (Hypophthalmichthys nobilis).

12 (B) Bitterling (Rhodeus sericeus).

13 (C) Black carp (Mylopharyngodon piceus).

14 (D) Eurasian ruffe (Gymnocephalus cernuus).

15 (E) Grass carp (Ctenopharyngodon idellus).

16 (F) Ide (Leuciscus idus).

17 (G) Japanese weatherfish (Misgurnus anguillicaudatus).

18 (H) Round goby (Neogobius melanostomus).

19 (I) Rudd (Scardinius erythrophthalamus).

20 (J) Silver carp (Hypophthalmichthys molitrix).

21 (K) A fish of the snakehead family (family Channidae).

22 (L) Tench (Tinca tinca).

23 (M) Tubenose goby (Proterorhinus marmoratus).

24 (vi) (v) Any of the following prohibited insect species,

25 including a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species 26 or an egg of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered 27 variant:

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(A) Asian longhorned beetle (Anoplophora glabripennis).

(B) Emerald ash borer (Agrilus planipennis).

3 (vii) (vi) The following prohibited mammal species, including a
4 hybrid or genetically engineered variant: nutria (Myocastor
5 coypus).

6 (viii) (vii) Any of the following prohibited mollusk species,
7 including a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species
8 or an egg of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered
9 variant:

10 (A) Brown garden snail (Helix aspersa).

11 (B) Carthusian snail (Monacha cartusiana).

12 (C) Giant African snail (Achatina fulica).

13 (D) Girdled snail (Hygromia cinctella).

14 (E) Heath snail (Xerolenta obvia).

15 (F) Wrinkled dune snail (Candidula intersecta).

16 (d) "Recombinant nucleic acid techniques" means laboratory
17 techniques through which genetic material is isolated and
18 manipulated in vitro and then inserted into an organism.

(e) "Restricted species", subject to section 41302, means anyof the following:

(i) Any of the following restricted aquatic plant species,
including a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species
or a fragment, including a seed or other propagule, of the species
or of a hybrid or genetically engineered variant:

25 (A) Curly leaf pondweed (Potamogeton crispus).

26 (B) Eurasian watermilfoil (Myriophyllum spicatum).

27 (C) Flowering rush (Butomus umbellatus).

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(D) Phragmites or common reed (Phragmites australis).

(E) Purple loosestrife (Lythrum salicaria), except that
cultivars of purple loosestrife developed and recognized to be
sterile and approved by the director of the department of
agriculture AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT under section 16a of the insect
pest and plant disease act, 1931 PA 189, MCL 286.216a, are not a
restricted species.

8 (*ii*) THE FOLLOWING RESTRICTED TERRESTRIAL PLANT SPECIES, 9 INCLUDING A HYBRID OR GENETICALLY ENGINEERED VARIANT OF THE SPECIES 10 OR A FRAGMENT, INCLUDING A SEED OR OTHER PROPAGULE, OF THE SPECIES 11 OR OF A HYBRID OR GENETICALLY ENGINEERED VARIANT: AUTUMN OLIVE 12 (ELAEAGNUS UMBELLATA).

13 (iii) (iii) Any of the following restricted mollusk species, 14 including a hybrid or genetically engineered variant of the species 15 or an egg of the species or of a hybrid or genetically engineered 16 variant:

17 (A) Quagga mussel (Dreissena bugensis).

18 (B) Zebra mussel (Dreissena polymorpha).

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(2) For the purposes of this part:

(a) A person is not considered to possess a live organism
simply because the organism is present on land or in waters owned
by that person unless the person has knowingly introduced that live
organism on that land or in those waters.

(b) A person is not considered to possess a live organism if the organism was obtained from the environment and the person only possesses the organism at the specific location at which it was obtained from the environment.

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(c) A person is not considered to possess a live organism if 1 the possession is for the purpose of promptly destroying the 2 organism. 3

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
