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REPORT BY FIRE MARSHAL: REPEAL

House Bill 6000 as introduced Sponsor: Rep. Beau Matthew LaFave

House Bill 6002 as introduced Sponsor: Rep. Sue Allor

SUMMARY:

<u>House Bill 6000</u> would repeal a section of the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act that required the fire marshal to provide a report to the Legislature by October 1, 2013 pertaining to the costs of inspections of retail locations selling fireworks for the purpose of establishing a consumer fireworks certificate fee.

MCL 28.471 (repealed)

House Bill 6002 would amend the Stille-DeRossett-Hale Single State Construction Code to delete a statutory reference to the section of the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act that would be repealed by House Bill 6000. The bill is tie-barred to House Bill 6000, meaning that unless that bill were also enacted, House Bill 6002 could not take effect.

MCL 125.1528

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 6000 would not have a significant fiscal impact on any unit of state or local government. The bill would delete a report required from the State Fire Marshal, which would not affect expenditures or revenues.
