

House Bill 5606 (Substitute S-1 as reported by the Committee of the Whole) Sponsor: Representative Jim Lilly House Committee: Regulatory Reform Senate Committee: Regulatory Reform

CONTENT

The bill would amend the Michigan Liquor Control Code to do the following:

- -- Modify certain classes of vendors that could sell alcoholic liquor at retail
- -- Include additional classes of vendors that could sell alcoholic liquor at retail.
- -- Delete various provisions allowing a wine maker to conduct wine tastings on its manufacturing premises.
- -- Delete a provision allowing a brandy manufacturer or small distiller to conduct tastings of brandy or spirits, respectively, on its manufacturing premises.
- -- Require a wine maker, brandy manufacturer, small distiller, micro brewer, brewer, or brewpub to provide water, and to allow these licensees, in their sole discretion, to sell or provide other nonalcoholic beverages for consumption on-or off-premises.
