HOUSE BILL NO. 4547

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled "The code of criminal procedure," by amending sections 33 and 48 of chapter XVII (MCL 777.33 and 777.48), as amended by 2013 PA 24.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

(2) As used in this section, "any bodily alcohol content"

- 1 means either of the following:
- 2 (a) An alcohol content of 0.02 grams or more but less than
- 3 0.08 grams per 100 milliliters of blood, per 210 liters of breath,
- 4 or per 67 milliliters of urine or, beginning October 1, 2018, 2023,
- 5 0.02 grams or more but less than 0.10 grams per 100 milliliters of
- blood, per 210 liters of breath, or per 67 milliliters of urine.
- (b) Any presence of alcohol within an individual's body 7
- resulting from the consumption of alcoholic or intoxicating liquor
- other than the consumption of alcoholic or intoxicating liquor as
- part of a generally recognized religious service or ceremony. 10
- 11 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 12 after the date it is enacted into law.
- Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect 13
- unless House Bill No. 4548 of the 99th Legislature is enacted into 14
