## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4174

A bill to amend 1996 PA 193, entitled "Michigan do-not-resuscitate procedure act," by amending sections 2 and 11 (MCL 333.1052 and 333.1061), as amended by 2013 PA 155, and by adding section 11a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Actual notice" includes the physical presentation of an
- 3 order, a revocation of an order, or other ANOTHER written document
- 4 authorized under this act from or on behalf of a declarant.
- 5 (b) "Attending physician" means the physician who has primary
- 6 responsibility for the treatment and care of a declarant.
- 7 (c) "Declarant" means an individual who has executed a do-not-
- 8 resuscitate order on his or her own behalf or on whose behalf a do-

- 1 not-resuscitate order has been executed as provided in this act.
- 2 (d) "Delegatee" means an individual to whom a physician has
- 3 delegated the authority to perform 1 or more selected acts, tasks,
- 4 or functions under section 16215 of the public health code, MCL
- **5** 333.16215.
- 6 (e) "Do-not-resuscitate identification bracelet" or
- 7 "identification bracelet" means a wrist bracelet that meets the
- 8 requirements of section 7 and that is worn by a declarant while a
- 9 do-not-resuscitate order is in effect.
- 10 (f) "Do-not-resuscitate order" or "order" means a document
- 11 executed under this act directing that, if an individual suffers
- 12 cessation of both spontaneous respiration and circulation in a
- 13 setting outside of a hospital, resuscitation will not be initiated.
- 14 (g) "Emergency medical technician" means that term as defined
- in section 20904 of the public health code, MCL 333.20904.
- 16 (h) "Emergency medical technician specialist" means that term
- 17 as defined in section 20904 of the public health code, MCL
- **18** 333.20904.
- 19 (i) "Guardian" means that term as defined in section 1104 of
- 20 the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL
- **21** 700.1104.
- 22 (j) "Hospital" means that term as defined in section 20106 of
- 23 the public health code, MCL 333.20106.
- 24 (k) "Medical first responder" means that term as defined in
- 25 section 20906 of the public health code, MCL 333.20906.
- 26 (1) "Nurse" means an individual licensed or otherwise
- 27 authorized to engage in the practice of nursing or practice of

- 1 nursing as a licensed practical nurse under part 172 of the public
- 2 health code, MCL 333.17201 to 333.17242.
- 3 (m) "Organization" means a company, corporation, firm,
- 4 partnership, association, trust, or other business entity or a
- 5 governmental agency.
- 6 (n) "Paramedic" means that term as defined in section 20908 of
- 7 the public health code, MCL 333.20908.
- 8 (o) "Patient advocate" means an individual designated to make
- 9 medical treatment decisions for a patient under sections 5506 to
- 10 5515 of the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386,
- 11 MCL 700.5506 to 700.5515.
- 12 (p) "Physician" means an individual licensed or otherwise
- 13 authorized to engage in the practice of medicine or the practice of
- 14 osteopathic medicine and surgery under article 15 of the public
- 15 health code, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- 16 (Q) "PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS
- 17 LICENSED AS A PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT UNDER PART 170 OR PART 175 OF
- 18 THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, MCL 333.17001 TO 333.17084 AND 333.17501 TO
- 19 333.17556.
- 20 (R) (q)—"Public health code" means the public health code,
- 21 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211.
- 22 (S) <del>(r)</del> "Vital sign" means a pulse or evidence of respiration.
- 23 (T) (s) "Ward" means that term as defined in section 1108 of
- 24 the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL
- **25** 700.1108.
- 26 Sec. 11. (1) One or more of the following health professionals
- 27 who arrive at a declarant's location outside of a hospital shall

- 1 determine if the declarant has 1 or more vital signs, whether or
- 2 not the health professional views or has actual notice of an order
- 3 that is alleged to have been executed by the declarant or other
- 4 person authorized to execute an order on the declarant's behalf:
- 5 (a) A paramedic.
- 6 (b) An emergency medical technician.
- 7 (c) An emergency medical technician specialist.
- 8 (d) A physician.
- 9 (e) A nurse.
- 10 (f) A medical first responder.
- (g) A respiratory therapist.
- 12 (H) A PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT.
- 13 (2) If the health professional determines under subsection (1)
- 14 that the declarant has no vital signs, and if the health
- 15 professional determines that the declarant is wearing a do-not-
- 16 resuscitate identification bracelet or has actual notice of a do-
- 17 not-resuscitate order for the declarant, he or she SUBJECT TO
- 18 SECTION 11A, THE HEALTH PROFESSIONAL shall not attempt to
- 19 resuscitate the declarant.
- 20 SEC. 11A. (1) IF A HEALTH PROFESSIONAL DESCRIBED IN SECTION 11
- 21 HAS ACTUAL NOTICE OF A DO-NOT-RESUSCITATE ORDER AND IS AWARE OF THE
- 22 EXISTENCE OF A VALIDLY EXECUTED POST FORM UNDER PART 56B OF THE
- 23 PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, MCL 333.5671 TO 333.5685, THAT CONTAINS A
- 24 MEDICAL ORDER REGARDING THE INITIATION OF RESUSCITATION IF THE
- 25 INDIVIDUAL SUFFERS CESSATION OF BOTH SPONTANEOUS RESPIRATION AND
- 26 CIRCULATION, THE HEALTH PROFESSIONAL SHALL COMPLY WITH THE MOST
- 27 RECENT ORDER OR FORM.

- 1 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "POST FORM" MEANS THAT TERM AS
- 2 DEFINED IN SECTION 5674 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, MCL 333.5674.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 3
- 4 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 5 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- unless House Bill No. 4170 of the 99th Legislature is enacted into 6
- 7 law.
