A bill to amend 1895 PA 215, entitled

"The fourth class city act,"

by amending section 1 of chapter XI (MCL 91.1), as amended by 1994 PA 19.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

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CHAPTER XI--GENERAL POWERS OF CITY CORPORATIONS

Sec. 1. (1) A-EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3), A city incorporated under the provisions of this act has, and the council may pass ordinances relating to, the following general powers:

6 (a) To restrain and prevent vice and immorality, gambling,
7 noise and disturbance, and indecent or disorderly conduct or
8 assemblages; to prevent and quell riots; to preserve peace and good
9 order; and to protect the property of the city or of persons in the

1 city.

2 (b) To prohibit vagrancy, truancy, begging, public3 drunkenness, disorderly conduct, or prostitution.

4 (c) To prevent injury or annoyance from anything dangerous,
5 offensive, or unhealthy; to prohibit and remove anything tending to
6 cause or promote disease; and to prevent and abate nuisances.

7 (d) To prohibit and suppress places of disorderly conduct,8 immorality, or vice.

9 (e) To regulate or license the use of places of entertainment.
10 (f) To prohibit and suppress gambling and to authorize the
11 seizure and destruction of instruments and devices used for
12 gambling.

(g) To prohibit and prevent the selling or giving of alcoholic
liquor , as THAT TERM IS defined in section 2 of the Michigan
liquor control act, Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of the Extra
Session of 1933, being section 436.2 of the Michigan Compiled
Laws.105 OF THE MICHIGAN LIQUOR CONTROL CODE OF 1998, 1998 PA 58,
MCL 436.1105.

(h) To regulate, restrain, or prohibit sports, exhibitions,
caravans, and shows for which money or other reward is demanded or
received, except lectures on historic, literary, or scientific
subjects.

(i) To prevent the violation of the Sabbath day, or the
disturbance of a religious meeting, congregation, or society or
other public meeting assembled for a lawful purpose; and to require
businesses to be closed on the Sabbath day.

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(j) To license, regulate, or prohibit auctioneers, auctions,

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1 and sales by public bids or offers by buyers or sellers in the 2 manner of auctions; and to regulate the fees to be paid by and to 3 auctioneers. However, a license shall IS not be required in case of 4 sales required by law to be made at auction.

5 (k) To license, regulate, or prohibit hawking and peddling and6 to license pawnbroking.

7 (l) To license and regulate wharf boats and to regulate the
8 use of boats in and about the harbor, if any, and within the
9 jurisdiction of the city.

10 (m) To establish, authorize, license, and regulate ferries to 11 and from the city or a place in the city; and to regulate and 12 prescribe the charges and prices for the transportation of persons 13 and property by ferry.

(n) To regulate and license taverns, houses of public
entertainment, saloons, restaurants, and eating houses; and to
regulate and prescribe the location of saloons. This subdivision
does not authorize the licensing of the sale of alcoholic liquor 7
as THAT TERM IS defined in section 2 of Act No. 8 of the Public
Acts of the Extra Session of 1933.105 OF THE MICHIGAN LIQUOR
CONTROL CODE OF 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1105.

(o) To license and regulate vehicles used for the
transportation of persons or property for hire in the city; and to
regulate or fix their stands on the streets and public places and
at wharves, boat landings, railroad station grounds, and other
places.

26 (p) To regulate and license toll bridges within the city and27 to prescribe the rates and charges for passage over the bridges.

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(q) To provide for and regulate the inspection of food.

2 (r) To regulate the inspection, weighing, and measuring of
3 brick, lumber, firewood, coal, hay, and any article of merchandise.
4 (s) To provide for the inspection and sealing of weights and

5 measures and to enforce the keeping and use of proper weights and
6 measures by venders.VENDORS.

7 (t) To regulate the construction, repair, and use of vaults,
8 cisterns, areas, hydrants, pumps, sewers, and gutters.

9 (u) To prohibit and prevent indecent exposure of the person;
10 the show, sale, or exhibition for sale of indecent or obscene
11 pictures, drawings, engravings, paintings, books, or pamphlets; and
12 indecent or obscene exhibitions and shows.

13 (v) To regulate or prohibit bathing in the city's bodies of14 water.

15 (w) To provide for the clearing of driftwood and noxious
16 matter from the city's bodies of water; and to prohibit and prevent
17 the depositing in the city's bodies of water of matter tending to
18 render the water impure, unwholesome, or offensive.

19 (x) To compel the owner or occupant of any grocery, tallow 20 chandler shop, soap or candy factory, butcher shop or stall, 21 slaughter house, stable, barn, privy, sewer, or other offensive, 22 nauseous, or unwholesome place to cleanse, remove, or abate it when 23 the council considers it necessary for the health, comfort, or 24 convenience of the inhabitants of the city.

(y) To regulate the keeping, selling, and using of dynamite,
gunpowder, firecrackers and fireworks, and other explosive or
combustible materials; to regulate the exhibition of fireworks and

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the discharge of firearms; and to restrain the making of fires in
 the streets and other open spaces in the city.

3 (z) To direct and regulate the construction of cellars, slips,4 barns, private drains, sinks, and privies.

5 (aa) To prohibit, prevent, and suppress mock auctions and
6 fraudulent games, devices, and practices. Persons managing, using,
7 or practicing; attempting to manage, use, or practice; or aiding in
8 the management or practice of a mock auction or fraudulent game,
9 device, or practice may be subject to the provisions of an
10 ordinance under this subdivision.

(bb) To prohibit, prevent, and suppress lotteries for the drawing or disposing of money or other property. Persons maintaining, directing, or managing such lotteries or aiding in the maintenance, directing, or managing of such lotteries may be subject to the provisions of an ordinance under this subdivision.

16 (cc) To license and regulate solicitors for passengers or for baggage to and from a hotel, tavern, public house, boat, or 17 18 railroad and to provide the places where they may be admitted to 19 solicit or receive patronage; and to license and regulate porters, 20 runners, and drivers of vehicles used and employed for hire, to 21 provide the places where they be ARE admitted to solicit or receive 22 patronage, and to fix and regulate the amounts and rates of their 23 compensation.

(dd) To provide for the protection and care of paupers.

(ee) To provide for taking a census of the inhabitants of the
city, whenever the council sees fit, and to direct and regulate the
census.

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(ff) To provide for the issuing of licenses to the owners and
 keepers of dogs and to require the owners and keepers of dogs to
 pay for and obtain such-licenses; and to regulate and prevent the
 running at large of dogs, to require dogs to be muzzled, and to
 authorize the killing of dogs running at large or not licensed in
 violation of an ordinance of the city.

7 (gg) To prohibit the possession or use of toy pistols,
8 slingshots, and other dangerous toys or implements within the city.

9 (hh) To require horses, mules, or other animals attached to
10 vehicles or standing in the streets, lanes, or alleys in the city
11 to be securely fastened, hitched, watched, or held and to regulate
12 the placing and provide for the preservation of hitching posts.

(ii) To provide for and regulate the numbering of buildings upon the streets and alleys; to require the owners or occupants of buildings to affix numbers on the buildings; and to designate and change the names of public streets, alleys, and parks.

17 (jj) To provide for, establish, regulate, and preserve public
18 fountains and reservoirs within the city, and troughs and basins
19 for watering animals.

(kk) To prevent or provide for the construction and operation of street railways, to regulate street railways, and to determine and designate the route and grade of any street railway to be laid or constructed in the city.

(*ll*) To establish and maintain a public library, to provide a
suitable building for that public library, and to aid in
maintaining such other public libraries as may be established
within the city by private beneficence as the council considers to

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1 be for the public good.

2 (mm) To license transient traders. In the case of transient 3 traders who engage in the business of selling goods or merchandise 4 after the commencement of the fiscal year, the license fee may be 5 apportioned with relation to the part of the fiscal year that has 6 expired. If such TRANSIENT traders continue in the same business 7 after the commencement of the next fiscal year, and their goods or merchandise are assessed for taxes for the next fiscal year, the 8 9 traders shall ARE not be required to take out a second license upon 10 the commencement of the next fiscal year.

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(2) The EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3), THE council may enact ordinances and make regulations, consistent with the laws and constitution of the THIS state as they may consider necessary for the safety, order, and good government of the city and the general welfare of the inhabitants of the city, but exclusive rights, privileges, or permits shall MUST not be granted by the council.

18 (3) THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT
19 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING ACT.

20 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days21 after the date it is enacted into law.

Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 5955 (request no.
03124'17) of the 99th Legislature is enacted into law.

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
