## **SENATE BILL No. 907**

## March 15, 2018, Introduced by Senator BRANDENBURG and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill to amend 1937 PA 94, entitled "Use tax act," by amending section 4 (MCL 205.94), as amended by 2017 PA 218.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 4. (1) The following are exempt from the tax levied under
 this act, subject to subsection (2):

3 (a) Property sold in this state on which transaction a tax is
4 paid under the general sales tax act, 1933 PA 167, MCL 205.51 to
5 205.78, if the tax was due and paid on the retail sale to a
6 consumer.

7 (b) Property, the storage, use, or other consumption of which
8 this state is prohibited from taxing under the constitution or laws
9 of the United States, or under the constitution of this state.

(c) All of the following:

(i) Property purchased for resale. Property purchased for

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resale includes promotional merchandise transferred pursuant to a
 redemption offer to a person located outside this state or any
 packaging material, other than promotional merchandise, acquired
 for use in fulfilling a redemption offer or rebate to a person
 located outside this state.

6 (*ii*) Property purchased for lending or leasing to a public or
7 parochial school offering a course in automobile driving except
8 that a vehicle purchased by the school shall be certified for
9 driving education and shall not be reassigned for personal use by
10 the school's administrative personnel.

11 (iii) Property purchased for demonstration purposes. For a new 12 vehicle dealer selling a new car or truck, exemption for 13 demonstration purposes shall be determined by the number of new 14 cars and trucks sold during the current calendar year or the 15 immediately preceding calendar year, without regard to specific make or style, according to the following schedule but not to 16 17 exceed 25 cars and trucks in 1 calendar year for demonstration 18 purposes:

- **19** (A) 0 to 25, 2 units.
- 20 (B) 26 to 100, 7 units.

**21** (C) 101 to 500, 20 units.

22 (D) 501 or more, 25 units.

(*iv*) Motor vehicles purchased for resale purposes by a new
vehicle dealer licensed under section 248(8)(a) of the Michigan
vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.248.

26 (d) Property that is brought into this state by a nonresident27 person for storage, use, or consumption while temporarily within

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this state, except if the property is used in this state in a
 nontransitory business activity for a period exceeding 15 days.

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(e) Property the sale or use of which was already subjected to 3 4 a sales tax or use tax equal to, or in excess of, that imposed by 5 this act under the law of any other state or a local governmental unit within a state if the tax was due and paid on the retail sale 6 to the consumer and the state or local governmental unit within a 7 state in which the tax was imposed accords like or complete 8 9 exemption on property the sale or use of which was subjected to the 10 sales or use tax of this state. If the sale or use of property was 11 already subjected to a tax under the law of any other state or local governmental unit within a state in an amount less than the 12 tax imposed by this act, this act shall apply, but at a rate 13 14 measured by the difference between the rate provided in this act 15 and the rate by which the previous tax was computed.

(f) Property sold to a person engaged in a business enterprise 16 17 and using and consuming the property in the tilling, planting, draining, caring for, or harvesting of the things of the soil, in 18 19 the breeding, raising, or caring for livestock, poultry, or 20 horticultural products, including transfers of livestock, poultry, 21 or horticultural products for further growth, or in the direct 22 gathering of fish, by net, by line, or otherwise only by an owner-23 operator of the business enterprise, not including a charter fishing business enterprise. This exemption includes machinery that 24 25 is capable of simultaneously harvesting grain or other crops and 26 biomass and machinery used for the purpose of harvesting biomass. 27 This exemption includes agricultural land tile, which means fired

clay or perforated plastic tubing used as part of a subsurface 1 2 drainage system for land, and subsurface irrigation pipe, if the land tile or irrigation pipe is used in the production of 3 4 agricultural products as a business enterprise. This exemption 5 includes a portable grain bin, which means a structure that is used 6 or is to be used to shelter grain and that is designed to be disassembled without significant damage to its component parts. 7 This exemption includes grain drying equipment and the fuel or 8 energy source that powers that equipment for agricultural purposes. 9 10 This exemption also includes tangible personal property affixed to 11 or to be affixed to and directly used in the operation of either a 12 portable grain bin or grain drying equipment. This exemption also includes the sale or acquisition of agricultural land tile, 13 14 portable grain bins, and grain drying equipment purchased or acquired by a person in the business of constructing, altering, 15 repairing, or improving real estate for others to the extent that 16 17 it is affixed to or made a structural part of real estate used for a purpose exempt under this subsection. This exemption does not 18 19 include transfers of food, fuel, clothing, or similar tangible 20 personal property for personal living or human consumption. Except 21 for agricultural land tile, subsurface irrigation pipe, portable 22 grain bins, and grain drying equipment, this exemption does not 23 include tangible personal property permanently affixed to and 24 becoming a structural part of real estate. As used in this 25 subdivision, "biomass" means crop residue used to produce energy or 26 agricultural crops grown specifically for the production of energy. 27 (g) Property or services sold to the United States, an

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unincorporated agency or instrumentality of the United States, an
 incorporated agency or instrumentality of the United States wholly
 owned by the United States or by a corporation wholly owned by the
 United States, the American Red Cross and its chapters or branches,
 this state, a department or institution of this state, or a
 political subdivision of this state.

7 (h) Property or services sold to a school, hospital, or home for the care and maintenance of children or aged persons, operated 8 9 by an entity of government, a regularly organized church, religious 10 ORGANIZATION, or fraternal organization, a veterans' organization, 11 or a corporation incorporated under the laws of this state, if not 12 operated for profit, and if the income or benefit from the operation does not inure, in whole or in part, to an individual or 13 14 private shareholder, directly or indirectly, and if the activities of the entity or agency are carried on exclusively for the benefit 15 of the public at large and are not limited to the advantage, 16 17 interests, and benefits of its members or a restricted group. The 18 tax levied does not apply to property or services sold to a parent 19 cooperative preschool. As used in this subdivision, "parent 20 cooperative preschool" means a nonprofit, nondiscriminatory educational institution, maintained as a community service and 21 22 administered by parents of children currently enrolled in the 23 preschool that provides an educational and developmental program 24 for children younger than compulsory school age, that provides an educational program for parents, including active participation 25 26 with children in preschool activities, that is directed by 27 qualified preschool personnel, and that is licensed pursuant to

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1 1973 PA 116, MCL 722.111 to 722.128.

2 (i) Property or services sold to a regularly organized church3 or house of religious worship except the following:

4 (i) Sales in which the property is used in activities that are5 mainly commercial enterprises.

6 (*ii*) Sales of vehicles licensed for use on the public highways
7 other than a passenger van or bus with a manufacturer's rated
8 seating capacity of 10 or more that is used primarily for the
9 transportation of persons for religious purposes.

(j) A vessel designed for commercial use of registered tonnage of 500 tons or more, if produced upon special order of the purchaser, and bunker and galley fuel, provisions, supplies, maintenance, and repairs for the exclusive use of a vessel of 500 tons or more engaged in interstate commerce.

(k) Property purchased for use in this state where actual personal possession is obtained outside this state, the purchase price or actual value of which does not exceed \$10.00 during 1 calendar month.

19 (1) A newspaper or periodical classified under federal postal 20 laws and regulations effective September 1, 1985 as second-class 21 mail matter or as a controlled circulation publication or qualified 22 to accept legal notices for publication in this state, as defined 23 by law, or any other newspaper or periodical of general 24 circulation, established at least 2 years, and published at least 25 once a week, and a copyrighted motion picture film. Tangible 26 personal property used or consumed in producing a copyrighted 27 motion picture film, a newspaper published more than 14 times per

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1 year, or a periodical published more than 14 times per year, and 2 not becoming a component part of that film, newspaper, or periodical is subject to the tax. After December 31, 1993, tangible 3 4 TANGIBLE personal property used or consumed in producing a newspaper published 14 times or less per year or a periodical 5 6 published 14 times or less per year and that portion or percentage of tangible personal property used or consumed in producing an 7 advertising supplement that becomes a component part of a newspaper 8 or periodical is exempt from the tax under this subdivision. A 9 10 claim for a refund for taxes paid before January 1, 1999 under this 11 subdivision shall be made before June 30, 1999. For purposes of 12 this subdivision, tangible personal property that becomes a component part of a newspaper or periodical and consequently not 13 14 subject to tax, includes an advertising supplement inserted into and circulated with a newspaper or periodical that is otherwise 15 exempt from tax under this subdivision, if the advertising 16 17 supplement is delivered directly to the newspaper or periodical by a person other than the advertiser, or the advertising supplement 18 19 is printed by the newspaper or periodical.

(m) Property purchased by persons licensed to operate a
commercial radio or television station if the property is used in
the origination or integration of the various sources of program
material for commercial radio or television transmission. This
subdivision does not include a vehicle licensed and titled for use
on public highways or property used in the transmitting to or
receiving from an artificial satellite.

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(n) A person who is a resident of this state who purchases an

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1 automobile in another state while in the military service of the 2 United States and who pays a sales tax in the state where the 3 automobile is purchased.

4 (o) A vehicle for which a special registration is secured in accordance with section 226(9) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 5 6 PA 300, MCL 257.226.

7 (p) The sale of a prosthetic device, durable medical equipment, or mobility enhancing equipment. 8

9 (q) Water when delivered through water mains, water sold in bulk tanks in quantities of not less than 500 gallons, or the sale 10 11 of bottled water.

12 (r) A vehicle not for resale used by a nonprofit corporation 13 organized exclusively to provide a community with ambulance or fire 14 department services.

(s) Tangible personal property purchased and installed as a 15 16 component part of a water pollution control facility for which a 17 tax exemption certificate is issued pursuant to part 37 of the 18 natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, 19 MCL 324.3701 to 324.3708, or an air pollution control facility for 20 which a tax exemption certificate is issued pursuant to part 59 of 21 the natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 22 451, MCL 324.5901 to 324.5908.

23 (t) Tangible real or personal property donated by a 24 manufacturer, wholesaler, or retailer to an organization or entity 25 exempt pursuant to subdivision (h) or (i) or section 4a(1)(a) or 26 (b) of the general sales tax act, 1933 PA 167, MCL 205.54a. 27

(u) The storage, use, or consumption of an aircraft by a

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1 domestic air carrier for use solely in the transport of air cargo, 2 passengers, or a combination of air cargo and passengers, that has a maximum certificated takeoff weight of at least 6,000 pounds. For 3 4 purposes of this subdivision, the term "domestic air carrier" is 5 limited to a person engaged primarily in the commercial transport 6 for hire of air cargo, passengers, or a combination of air cargo and passengers as a business activity. The state treasurer shall 7 estimate on January 1 each year the revenue lost by this act from 8 9 the school aid fund and deposit that amount into the school aid 10 fund from the general fund.

(v) The storage, use, or consumption of an aircraft by a person who purchases the aircraft for subsequent lease to a domestic air carrier operating under a certificate issued by the federal aviation administration under 14 CFR part 121, for use solely in the regularly scheduled transport of passengers.

16 (w) Property or services sold to an organization not operated 17 for profit and exempt from federal income tax under section 18 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) of the internal revenue code, 26 USC 501; or 19 to a health, welfare, educational, cultural arts, charitable, or 20 benevolent organization not operated for profit that has been 21 issued before June 13, 1994 an exemption ruling letter to purchase 22 items exempt from tax signed by the administrator of the sales, 23 use, and withholding taxes division of the department. The 24 department shall reissue an exemption letter after June 13, 1994 to 25 each of those organizations that had an exemption letter that shall 26 remain in effect unless the organization fails to meet the 27 requirements that originally entitled it to this exemption. The

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exemption does not apply to sales of tangible personal property and sales of vehicles licensed for use on public highways, that are not used primarily to carry out the purposes of the organization as stated in the bylaws or articles of incorporation of the exempt organization.

6 (x) The use or consumption of services described in section
7 3a(1)(a) or (b) or 3b by means of a prepaid telephone calling card,
8 a prepaid authorization number for telephone use, or a charge for
9 internet access.

(y) The purchase, lease, use, or consumption of the following
by an industrial laundry: after December 31, 1997:

12 (i) Textiles and disposable products including, but not
13 limited to, soap, paper, chemicals, tissues, deodorizers and
14 dispensers, and all related items such as packaging, supplies,
15 hangers, name tags, and identification tags.

16 (*ii*) Equipment, whether owned or leased, used to repair and 17 dispense textiles including, but not limited to, roll towel 18 cabinets, slings, hardware, lockers, mop handles and frames, and 19 carts.

20 (*iii*) Machinery, equipment, parts, lubricants, and repair
21 services used to clean, process, and package textiles and related
22 items, whether owned or leased.

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(*iv*) Utilities such as electric, gas, water, or oil.

24 (v) Production washroom equipment and mending and packaging25 supplies and equipment.

26 (vi) Material handling equipment including, but not limited27 to, conveyors, racks, and elevators and related control equipment.

(vii) Wastewater pretreatment equipment and supplies and
 related maintenance and repair services.

3 (z) Property purchased or manufactured by a person engaged in
4 the business of constructing, altering, repairing, or improving
5 real estate for others, to the extent that the property is affixed
6 to and made a structural part of real estate located in another
7 state, regardless of whether sales or use tax was due and paid in
8 the state in which the property is affixed to real estate.

(aa) The sale of a dental prosthesis.

(BB) THE PURCHASE OR LEASE OF A SCHOOL BUS OR SERVICES, AND 10 11 PARTS AFFIXED OR TO BE AFFIXED TO A SCHOOL BUS WHICH ARE USED IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF A SCHOOL BUS, IF THE SCHOOL BUS OR 12 SERVICES ARE USED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF A CONTRACT ENTERED INTO 13 WITH AN AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE OF A SCHOOL FOR THE 14 TRANSPORTATION OF PREPRIMARY, PRIMARY, OR SECONDARY SCHOOL PUPILS 15 TO OR FROM A SCHOOL OR SCHOOL-RELATED EVENTS AUTHORIZED BY THE 16 ADMINISTRATION OF THE SCHOOL. AS USED IN THIS SUBDIVISION: 17

18 (i) "LEASE" MEANS ANY TRANSFER OF POSSESSION OR CONTROL FOR A
19 FIXED OR INDETERMINATE TERM FOR CONSIDERATION AND MAY INCLUDE
20 FUTURE OPTIONS TO PURCHASE OR EXTEND.

21 (*ii*) "SCHOOL" MEANS A PUBLIC SCHOOL OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY
22 AS DEFINED IN SECTION 5 OF THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451,
23 MCL 380.5.

24 (*iii*) "SCHOOL BUS" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION 7 OF
25 THE PUPIL TRANSPORTATION ACT, 1990 PA 187, MCL 257.1807.

26 (2) The property or services under subsection (1) are exempt27 only to the extent that the property or services are used for the

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exempt purposes if one is stated in subsection (1). The exemption
 is limited to the percentage of exempt use to total use determined
 by a reasonable formula or method approved by the department.
