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## **SENATE BILL No. 1264**

December 6, 2018, Introduced by Senator MEEKHOF and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 28.292), as amended by 2018 PA 176.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card
  must contain the following:
  - (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the individual to whom the card is issued.
- (b) The full legal name, date of birth, sex, residenceaddress, height, weight, eye color, digital photographic image,

- 1 signature of or verification and certification by the applicant, as
- 2 determined by the secretary of state, and expiration date of the
- 3 official state personal identification card. If an official state
- 4 personal identification card is issued to an individual described
- 5 in section 1(5) who has temporary lawful status, the official state
- 6 personal identification card shall be issued in compliance with 6
- 7 CFR 37.21 or in compliance with the process established to comply
- 8 with 6 CFR 37.71 by the secretary of state. As used in this
- 9 subdivision, "temporary lawful status" means that term as defined
- **10** in 6 CFR 37.3.
- 11 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or
- more of the following:
- 13 (i) The blood type of the individual.
- 14 (ii) Immunization data of the individual.
- 15 (iii) Medication data of the individual.
- 16 (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.
- 17 (d) In the case of a holder of an official state personal
- 18 identification card who has indicated his or her wish to
- 19 participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of
- 20 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, a
- 21 heart insignia on the front of the official state personal
- 22 identification card.
- 23 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran as that
- 24 term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61, a
- 25 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation shall
- 26 be in a style and format considered appropriate by the secretary of
- 27 state. The secretary of state shall require proof of discharge or

- 1 separation of service from the armed forces of this state, another
- 2 state, or the United States, and the nature of that discharge, for
- 3 the purposes of verifying an individual's status as a veteran under
- 4 this subdivision. The secretary of state shall consult with the
- 5 department of military and veterans affairs in determining the
- 6 proof that shall be required to identify an individual's status as
- 7 a veteran for the purposes of this subsection. The secretary of
- 8 state may provide the department of military and veterans affairs
- 9 and agencies of the counties of this state that provide veteran
- 10 services with information provided by an applicant under this
- 11 subsection for the purpose of veterans' benefits eligibility
- 12 referral.
- 13 (f) Physical security features designed to prevent tampering,
- 14 counterfeiting, or duplication of the official state personal
- 15 identification card for fraudulent purposes.
- 16 (2) In conjunction with the application for an official state
- 17 personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all
- 18 of the following:
- (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- 20 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
- 21 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public
- 22 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in
- 23 accordance with this section.
- 24 (ii) Information describing the donor registry program
- 25 maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
- 26 organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of
- 27 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information

- 1 required under this subparagraph includes the address and telephone
- 2 number of Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
- 3 organization or its successor organization as described in section
- 4 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120.
- 5 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have
- 6 his or her name placed on the registry described in subparagraph
- 7 (ii).
- 8 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 9 his or her official state personal identification card that he or
- 10 she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death
- 11 under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 12 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance with this section.
- 13 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the
- 14 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his or
- 15 her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision
- 16 (a) (ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record
- 17 for the donor registry.
- 18 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 19 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 21 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal
- 22 identification card.
- 23 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally
- 24 appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 25 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 26 applications processed by electronic means.
- 27 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the

- 1 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state
- 2 shall designate a space on the official state personal
- 3 identification card where the applicant may place a sticker or
- 4 decal of a uniform size as the secretary may specify to indicate
- 5 that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical
- 6 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any
- 7 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested
- 8 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information
- 9 card, but must meet the specifications of the secretary of state.
- 10 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the
- 11 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance
- 12 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,
- 13 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,
- 14 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information
- 15 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the
- 16 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical
- 17 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored
- 18 or registered emergency medical information. An original official
- 19 state personal identification card or the renewal of an existing
- 20 official state personal identification card issued to an individual
- 21 less than 21 years of age must be portrait or vertical in form, and
- 22 an official state personal identification card issued to an
- 23 individual 21 years of age or over must be landscape or horizontal
- 24 in form. Except as otherwise required in this act, other
- 25 information required on the official state personal identification
- 26 card under this act may appear on the official state personal
- 27 identification card in a form prescribed by the secretary of state.

- 1 (5) The official state personal identification card must not
- 2 contain a fingerprint or finger image of the applicant.
- 3 (6) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 4 state shall retain and use an individual's digital photographic
- 5 image and signature described in subsection (1)(b) only for
- 6 programs administered by the secretary of state as specifically
- 7 authorized by law. An individual's digital photographic image or
- 8 signature must only be used as follows:
- 9 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a
- 10 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.
- 11 (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically
- 12 authorized by law.
- 13 (c) For the secretary of state to forward to the department of
- 14 state police the images of individuals required to be registered
- 15 under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.721
- 16 to 28.736, upon the department of state police providing the
- 17 secretary of state an updated list of those individuals.
- (d) For the secretary of state to forward to the department of
- 19 state police a digitized photograph taken of the applicant for an
- 20 official state personal identification card for use as provided in
- 21 section 5c of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.425c.
- 22 (E) BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FORWARDING TO THE DEPARTMENT
- 23 OF LICENSING AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS THE IMAGES OF APPLICANTS FOR AN
- 24 OFFICIAL STATE REGISTRY IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED UNDER SECTION 6
- 25 OF THE MICHIGAN MEDICAL MARIHUANA ACT, 2008 IL 1, MCL 333.26426, IF
- 26 A PHOTOGRAPH IS REQUIRED FOR AN OFFICIAL STATE REGISTRATION CARD BY
- 27 THE DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS.

- 1 (F) <del>(e)</del> As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the
- 2 United States.
- 3 (7) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 4 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued
- 5 or is the holder of an official state personal identification card,
- 6 the secretary of state shall mark the individual's official state
- 7 personal identification card in a manner that clearly indicates
- 8 that the cardholder is legally blind.
- 9 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an
- 10 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name
- 11 placed on the donor registry described in subsection (2)(a)(ii).
- 12 Information about an individual's indication of a willingness to
- 13 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is obtained
- 14 by the secretary of state and forwarded under this section is
- 15 exempt from disclosure under section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of
- 16 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243. As required in section
- 17 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the
- 18 secretary of state shall establish and maintain the donor registry
- 19 in a manner that complies with that section and that provides
- 20 electronic access, including, but not limited to, the transfer of
- 21 data to this state's federally designated organ procurement
- 22 organization or its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye
- 23 banks.
- 24 (9) An official state personal identification card may contain
- 25 an identifier for voter registration purposes.
- 26 (10) An official state personal identification card must
- 27 contain information appearing in electronic or machine readable

- 1 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.
- 2 The information must be limited to the information described in
- 3 subsection (1)(a) and (b) except for the person's digital
- 4 photographic image and signature or verification and certification,
- 5 state of issuance, and other information necessary for use with
- 6 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines
- 7 and must not contain the individual's driving record or other
- 8 personal identifier. The official state personal identification
- 9 card must identify the encoded information.
- 10 (11) An official state personal identification card must be
- 11 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and must
- 12 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the
- 13 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the
- 14 official state personal identification card without ready
- 15 detection.
- 16 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant
- 17 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
- 18 original or renewal official state personal identification card
- 19 issued. The department of treasury shall deposit the fees received
- 20 and collected under this section in the state treasury to the
- 21 credit of the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the
- 22 fees credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary
- 23 of state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from
- 24 the Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951
- 25 PA 51, MCL 247.660, must not be used to compensate the secretary of
- 26 state for costs incurred and services performed under this section.
- 27 (13) An original or renewal official state personal

- 1 identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to
- 2 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance
- 3 or on the date the individual is no longer considered to be legally
- 4 present in the United States under section 1, whichever is earlier.
- 5 The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal
- 6 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4
- 7 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 8 state may issue a renewal official state personal identification
- 9 card for 1 additional 4-year period by mail or by other methods
- 10 prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall
- 11 require renewal in person by an individual required under section
- 12 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a,
- 13 to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
- 14 state personal identification card.
- 15 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this
- 16 section if the applicant is any of the following:
- 17 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.
- 18 (b) An individual who has had his or her operator's or
- 19 chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied under the
- 20 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because
- 21 of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.
- 22 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 23 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.
- 24 (d) An individual who presents other good cause for a fee
- 25 waiver.
- 26 (e) An individual who decides to add or remove a heart
- insignia described in subsection (1)(d).

- 1 (15) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 2 personal identification card shall apply for a renewal official
- 3 state personal identification card if the individual changes his or
- 4 her name.
- 5 (16) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 6 personal identification card shall apply for a corrected
- 7 identification card if he or she changes his or her residence
- 8 address. The secretary of state may correct the address on an
- 9 official state personal identification card by a method prescribed
- 10 by the secretary of state. A fee must not be charged for a change
- 11 of residence address.
- 12 (17) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 13 personal identification card may apply for a renewal official state
- 14 personal identification card for 1 or more of the following
- 15 reasons:
- 16 (a) The individual wants to change any information on the
- 17 official state personal identification card.
- 18 (b) An official state personal identification card issued
- 19 under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes
- 20 illegible.
- 21 (18) An individual may indicate on an official state personal
- 22 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state
- 23 his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization
- 24 data, medication data, or a statement that the individual is deaf.
- 25 (19) No later than January 1, 2017, the secretary of state
- 26 shall develop and shall, in conjunction with the department of
- 27 state police, implement a process using the L.E.I.N. or any other

- 1 appropriate system that limits access to law enforcement that
- 2 allows law enforcement agencies of this state to access emergency
- 3 contact information that the holder of an official state personal
- 4 identification card has voluntarily provided to the secretary of
- 5 state. As used in this subsection, "emergency contact information"
- 6 means the name, telephone number, or address of an individual that
- 7 is used for the sole purpose of contacting that individual when the
- 8 holder of an official state personal identification card has been
- 9 involved in an emergency.
- 10 (20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state
- 11 that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA
- 12 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal identification
- 13 card must bear the designation of the individual's emancipated
- 14 status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state.
- 15 (21) The secretary of state shall inquire of each individual
- 16 who applies for or who holds an official state personal
- 17 identification card, in person or by mail, whether he or she agrees
- 18 to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101
- 19 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.
- 20 An individual who has agreed to participate in the donor registry
- 21 is not considered to have revoked that agreement solely because the
- 22 individual's official state personal identification card has
- 23 expired. Enrollment in the donor registry is a legal agreement that
- 24 remains binding and in effect after the donor's death regardless of
- 25 the expressed desires of the deceased donor's next of kin who may
- 26 oppose the donor's anatomical gift.
- 27 (22) A valid official state personal identification card

- 1 presented by the individual to whom the card is issued is
- 2 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license
- 3 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
- 4 provided by law.
