PART 2

13 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

14 GENERAL SECTIONS

Sec. 201. In accordance with section 30 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources in this appropriation act for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019 is \$12,000,000.00 and state spending from state sources to be paid to local units of government is <<\$100,000.00>>.

Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this act are
subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
to 18.1594.

23 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT

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Sec. 301. Funds appropriated in section 1 for the dairy

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1 industry assistance program shall be disbursed equally among all

2 dairy producers in the state licensed under the grade A milk law of

3 2001, 2001 PA 266, MCL 288.471 to 288.540, as of January 1, 2019.

4 The department shall coordinate the distribution of funds through

5 licensed cooperatives for the farmer members.

<< Sec. 302. The department shall partner with DHHS to notify 6 recipients of food assistance program benefits that their benefits can be 7 8 spent with their bridge cards at many farmer's markets in this state. The department shall also partner with DHHS to notify recipients about the double up food bucks program that is administered by the fair food network. Recipients shall receive information about the double up food 9 10 11 bucks program, including information that when the recipient spends up to 12 13 \$20.00 at participating farmer's markets and grocery stores through the program, the recipient can receive an additional \$20.00 to buy Michigan 14 produce. The department shall work with the Fair Food Network to expand 15 access to the double up food bucks program in each of the state's 16 counties with grocery stores or farmer's markets that meet the program's eligibility requirements.>>

17 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

18 Sec. 401. The funds appropriated in part 1 for census-related 19 services shall be distributed to an organization that received the 20 largest share of funding from the census-related services 21 appropriation in article X of 2018 PA 207 to support census 22 outreach and preparation for citizen participation in the upcoming 23 2020 federal census. The purpose of the funding is to prepare for 24 the census to ensure an accurate citizen count. The funding will be 25 used to support staffing related to census outreach, and 26 implementation of outreach strategies, including, but not limited

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to, training for local officials, support of local complete count
 committees, public outreach and communications campaigns, and
 coordination with the Michigan nonprofit complete count committee.

4 DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS

5 Sec. 431. The funds appropriated to the department of licensing and regulatory affairs in part 1 for implementation of 6 the Michigan regulation and taxation of marihuana act, 2018 IL 1, 7 MCL 333.27951 to 333.27967, shall be expended by the department in 8 coordination with other state agencies for implementation costs as 9 10 specified in that act. The department of licensing and regulatory 11 affairs shall provide a report to the chairs of the senate and 12 house appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget office no later than August 1, 2019 13 14 detailing implementation costs by agency. Consistent with the provisions of the Michigan regulation and taxation of marihuana 15 act, 2018 IL 1, MCL 333.27951 to 333.27967, the general 16 17 fund/general purpose revenue shall be repaid from proceeds 18 collected under that act.

19 DEPARTMENT OF TALENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Sec. 501. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan enhancement grants, \$500,000.00 shall be awarded to a nonprofit organization that has been established for at least 10 years, that is exempt from federal income taxation under section 501(c)(6) of the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, and that promotes the aerospace manufacturing industry in this state to 1 develop a maintenance, repair, and overhaul facility at an airport
2 located in a county with a population greater than 1,500,000 and in
3 a charter township with a population between 28,500 and 30,000 and
4 located in a county with a population between 340,000 and 345,000
5 and in a charter township with a population between 53,000 and
6 55,000, according to the most recent federal decennial census.

7 (2) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
8 enhancement grants, \$2,000,000.00 shall be awarded to a nonprofit
9 organization that has been established for at least 10 years, that
10 is exempt from federal income taxation under section 501(c)(6) of
11 the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, that promotes the
12 aerospace manufacturing industry in this state to develop a low13 orbit launch site within this state.

14 (3) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan 15 enhancement grants, \$200,000.00 shall be awarded for a bridge 16 project located in a county with a population between 161,000 and 17 170,000 and in a township with a population between 3,300 and 3,500 18 according to the most recent federal decennial census.

(4) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan enhancement grants, \$300,000.00 shall be awarded to a fire department located in a county with a population over 1,500,000 and in a city with a population between 40,000 and 60,000 according to the most recent federal decennial census.

(5) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
enhancement grants, \$5,000,000.00 shall be awarded to a county with
a population between 80,000 and 85,000 according to the most recent
federal decennial census for dam improvements on 1 or more dams, if

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1 the dam meets all of the following criteria:

2 (a) The dam is located either in a county with a population
3 between 80,000 and 85,000 or in a county with a population between
4 25,000 and 25,800 according to the most recent federal decennial
5 census.

6 (b) The dam is regulating or maintaining a lake level that is
7 established under part 307 of the natural resources and
8 environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.30701 to
9 324.30723.

10 (6) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
11 enhancement grants, \$3,000,000.00 shall be awarded to a city with a
12 population between 10,000 and 20,000 in a county with a population
13 between 170,000 and 180,000 according to the most recent federal
14 decennial census for street and pedestrian infrastructure upgrades.

Sec. 502. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan enhancement grants, the department shall execute a grant form with each recipient, pursuant to subsection (2). All grant funds are considered to be direct appropriations and, subject to receipt of all information under subsections (2) and (3), shall be fully dispersed by the department to each recipient by May 30, 2019.

(2) The department shall develop a grant form for each
recipient to complete in order to receive funding from part 1. The
form shall include the following:

25 (a) All necessary identifying information for the recipient,26 including any necessary tax identification information.

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(b) A description of the project for which the grant funds

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will be expended, including tentative timeline and estimated
 budget.

3 (c) A requirement for quarterly reports from the recipient to
4 the department that provide an accounting of all funds received by
5 the recipient and status of the project.

6 (d) A claw-back provision that allows this state to recoup or7 otherwise collect any funds that are unspent or otherwise misused.

8 (3) The grantee shall respond to all reasonable information
9 requests from the department related to grant expenditures and
10 retain grant records for a period of not less than 3 years, and the
11 grant may be subject to audit as determined by the department. The
12 grant form required under subsection (2) shall include signed
13 assurance by the chief executive officer or other executive officer
14 of the grant recipient that this requirement will be met.

(4) All funds awarded shall be expended by the recipient, and projects completed, by January 31, 2021. If at that time, as evidenced by the quarterly reports, any unexpended funds remain, those funds shall be returned by the grantee to the state treasury. The state budget director may, on a case by case basis, extend this deadline, upon request by a grant recipient.

(5) The department shall provide quarterly updates on the accounting and status of each project to the senate and house appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the state budget office.

25 REPEALER

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Enacting section 1. Section 304 of 2018 PA 618 is repealed.

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
